|       |                                 | Private Tour of Durham Cathedral - includes the history and development of the   |
|       |                                 | Cathedral, the Shrine of St Cuthbert, the Tomb of the Venerable Bede, the Galilee  |
|       |                                 | Chapel, the Chapel of the Nine Altars, the Nave and the Quire.   |
|       |                                 | Built as a monastic cathedral by the Benedictines from 1093 to 1133, Durham Cathedral boasts some of the   |
|       |                                 | most intact surviving monastic buildings in England. It has been a place of worship, welcome and hospitality for   |
|       |                                 | almost a millennium, inspiring all who come. Located at the heart of the Durham UNESCO World Heritage Site, Durham Cathedral is one of the best examples of Romanesque architecture in Europe and is famous as the |
|       |                                 | Shrine of St Cuthbert and the resting place of the Venerable Bede.   |

|       |                                 | Buffet Lunch in Prior's Hall Durham (Lunch in the medieval Prior's Hall, which was   |
|       |                                 | formally the Prior's dining room when the Cathedral was a Monastery.)  |
